A member of the [Democratic Party](#), McAuliffe was co-chairman of President [Bill Clinton](#)'s 1996 re-election campaign, chairman of the [Democratic National Committee](#) from 2001 to 2005, and chairman of [Hillary Clinton](#)'s [2008 presidential campaign](#). Glenn Allen Youngkin (born December 9, 1966) is an American businessman who is the [Republican](#) nominee in the [2021 Virginia gubernatorial election](#). Prior to entering politics, he spent 25 years at the private-equity firm [The Carlyle Group](#), rising to become its CEO. He stepped down from the Carlyle Group in 2020, and announced his candidacy for the [2021 Virginia gubernatorial election](#) in January 2021. Youngkin won the Republican gubernatorial nomination on May 10, 2021 (source: Wikipedia).
